When Carl Jung embarked on an extended self-exploration, the result was *The Red Book*, a large, illuminated volume he created between 1914 and 1930. With painstaking detail, Jung recorded numerous paintings, images, dialogues, and reflections, revealing his rich, archetypal world. *The Red Book* holds the inspiration for much of his pioneering theories and clinical techniques. One of the most closely guarded Jungian works, *The Red Book* contains the record of Jung's most personal journey, and until recently only a handful of people had ever seen it. In 2009, a complete facsimile and translation was made available to scholars and the general public, allowing readers to grasp the genesis of his later work. In these two 3-hour seminars, Dr. Stein leads us through Jung's fascinating journey. **At the seminars on January 28 and 29, there will be time for discussion and an opportunity to see a copy of *The Red Book*.**

Murray Stein is a training analyst at The International School for Analytical Psychology in Zurich, Switzerland. Recent publications include *The Principle of Individuation*, *Jung's Map of the Soul* and *The Edinburgh International Encyclopedia of Psychoanalysis*. Dr. Stein lectures internationally on topics related to Analytical Psychology and its applications in the contemporary world.
